#### Introduction

At Greenfield School we are committed to ensuring equality of education and opportunity for disabled pupils, staff and all those coming into contact with the school. For the purposes of this document 'disabled' refers not only to those with physical disabilities but includes also those who have English as an additional Language (EAL), those with special educational needs (SEND) and those with health issues including mental health. We aim to develop a culture of inclusion and diversity in which pupils, parents, visitors and staff feel free to disclose their disability and to participate fully in school life.

We will make reasonable adjustments to make sure that the school environment is as accessible as possible. At Greenfield School, we believe that diversity is a strength, which should be respected and celebrated by all those who learn, teach and visit here.

This plan is drawn up in accordance with the planning duty in the Equality Act 2010 and the definitions of special educational needs and disability in the Education Act 1996 and the and Children and Families Act 2014. Regard has also been given to the non-statutory DfE guidelines: Supporting pupils at school with medical conditions April 2014 and Mental Health and Behaviour in School March 16.

Greenfield moved to its current site in September 2019. The extension, which was completed in April 2022 now allows disabled access to the whole building as a lift has been installed.

#### Aim

To reduce and eliminate barriers to access the curriculum and full participation in the Greenfield School community for pupils, prospective pupils and adult users with a disability.

### **Principles**

- Compliance with the Equality Act 2010 is consistent with the school's aims and equal opportunities policy and the operation of the school's policy for learning support, special educational needs and disability.
- The school recognises its duty under the Equality Act 2010, Education Act 1996 and Children and Families Act 2014.
- Not to discriminate against disabled pupils in their admissions and exclusions, and provision of education and associated services.
- Not to treat disabled pupils less favourably.
- To take reasonable steps to avoid putting disabled pupils at a substantial disadvantage in the matters of admission and education
- To publish an Accessibility Plan.
- The school has a duty to make reasonable adjustments and a duty to provide auxiliary aids and services.
- In performing their duties, Governors and staff will have regard to the Disability Rights Commission Code of Practice (Dec 2005).
- The school recognises and values parents' knowledge of their child's disability and its effect on his/her ability to carry out normal activities and respects the right of parents and children to confidentiality.

The school provides all pupils with a broad and balanced curriculum, differentiated and adjusted to meet the needs of individual pupils and their preferred learning styles and disabilities. It achieves this by:

- Setting suitable learning challenges
- Responding to pupils' diverse learning needs
- Overcoming potential barriers to learning and assessment for individuals and groups of pupils.

### **Activity**

Greenfield School has identified the following points for action in order to achieve the key objective.

### **Delivery of the curriculum**

School staff receive training in making the curriculum accessible to all pupils, and are aware of its importance.

The school will continue to seek and follow the advice of appropriate health professionals, specialists and parents.

Greenfield has a Learning Enrichment Department. Within this department is a Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCo), an Assistant SENCo, a SEND Teaching Assistant, an English as an Additional Language (EAL) Coordinator and an Able, Gifted and Talented (A, G & T) Coordinator who support and advise teaching staff.

## **Physical environment**

The school will take account of the needs of pupils and other users with physical difficulties and sensory impairments when planning and undertaking future improvements and refurbishments of the site and premises, such as improved access, lighting, acoustic treatment and colour schemes, and more accessible facilities, fixtures and fittings.
