#### HAIR STYLES AND ACCESSORIES

Fringes should not cover a child's eyes. Closely shaven hair and fashion hairstyles are not permitted. Where a child's hair falls below the collar, it should be tied back using a scrunchie or headband available from Stevensons or plain dark/bottle green hair accessories.

### MODESTY

We want all of our pupils to feel comfortable in their uniform and be able to participate fully in school life.

For those choosing to wear Option B of the summer uniform (summer dress), children are permitted to wear white leggings of any length under their dress. For the PE kit, children have the option to wear black or navy baselayer under their shorts or skort. For Option B of the winter uniform (pinafore or skirt), children are permitted to wear bottle green tights.

Any additional garments which children wear in line with their cultural or religious beliefs (e.g. head covering) should be either black, bottle green or white - reflective of the winter/summer uniform being worn.

#### LABELLING UNIFORM

All uniform must be labelled with the child's first initial(s) and surname.

Shirts, tops, sweatshirts etc. should be labelled in the back of the neck.

Trousers, shorts, jogging bottoms etc. should be labelled in the back of the waistband.

PE kit should be labelled using 1" name tapes displaying the child's first initial and surname (green text on a white background). On tops, this should be sewn along the hem on the same side of the logo. On bottoms, this should be sewn along the hem on the same leg as the logo.

Shoes should be labelled on the inside sole using a 'sharpie' or marker pen.

Bags, accessories, equipment and all other items should be labelled in a clear and obvious place to aid staff when lost items are handed in.

Labelling items with a mark or symbol is not acceptable as it does not enable staff to identify the owner.

Items that are handed in to the school office without an obvious name label are placed in the lost property basket for one term. After one term, unclaimed items are donated to the second hand uniform or a suitable charity.
